- ❖ **A record attendance of 110:** The April 27 program, a witty presentation by **Patrick Smith** of Merritt Island, noted author of several books based on the history of Florida, including Forever Island and A Land Remembered, brought a record attendance of 110.
 - ❖ **LANDSCAPING WORKSHOP:** On May 24, the library hosted a free seminar, "Environmentally Friendly Landscaping for Your Florida Yard" presented by **Doug Kutz** of the University of Florida's Brevard County Extension Office.  - ❖ **A BOOK DISCUSSION!** On Thursday, June 22, **Dr. Carolyn Rylander**, of Rollins College, led a discussion of the book Before His Time: the Untold Story of Harry T. Moore, America's First Civil Rights Martyr by Bert Green. The author of this book, you may recall, spoke at our library's Black History Month program on February 22, about the lives and deaths of Harry T. and Harriett V. Moore. The Moores, working in the national struggle toward civil rights and racial equality, were victims of a bombing at their Mims home in 1951.
 - ❖ **MEET YOUR COMMISSIONER!** Bring your questions and community concerns to our representative to the Brevard County Board of Commissioners, **Truman Scarborough, Jr.**, on Thursday, July 27, at 7:00 p.m., at the library. This visit by Commissioner Scarborough, who was instrumental in the 1998 establishment of our library, is sponsored by the Mims/Scottsmeer Library Board. Of particular focus at this meeting he would like to discuss the proposed November tax referendum and recreational facility needs in this part of the county.
